## PRELIMINARY INFORMATION

**Subject:** SES Light with DTC: P0AE3

**Models:** 2016-2017 Chevrolet Volt

*This PI is being superseded to add 2017 Model Year Please discard PIC6165.*

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

### Condition/Concern

Some customers may experience a SES lamp with a history or current DTC: P0AE3

### Recommendation/Instructions

If you experience this concern, please don't replace any parts on the vehicle.

Engineering is aware of the concern and a new calibration to address the concern is expected March/April 2016.

Please communicate to the customer that we apologize for this inconvenience and that General Motors is working on a solution for this concern.

Once a solution is available, this PI will be updated with additional details - allowing dealership personnel to contact the customer to schedule a service appointment and repair the vehicle.

**Note:** Advise the customer that this concern may happen in certain *cool* environmental conditions combined with a battery which has completed charging.

There are no drivability or performance issues associated with this concern and the frequency rate is rare.

The malfunction indicator lamp will extinguish after 3 drive cycles if the condition has not repeated."

Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.
