Attention: This Bulletin also applies to any of the above models that may be Export from North America vehicles.

This PI has been revised to update the Recommendation/Instructions and add the Parts and Warranty Information. Please discard PI1421.

Condition/Concern

Some customers may comment that the heated steering wheel feels warmer than expected for the first 10 minutes of operation.

The peak temperature may exceed a target temperature of 40-43°C (105-110°F) until the steering wheel temperature stabilizes.

Recommendation/Instructions

Replace the steering wheel with the new designed steering wheel. Refer to Steering Wheel Replacement in SI.
