Condition	Some customers may comment that the gas tank is hard to fill.
Cause	This condition may be due to the mold flashing issue on the check valve internal to the fuel tank.

Correction

Refer to Poor Fuel Fill Quality for diagnosis in SI. If SI diagnostic does not isolate the root cause, replace the fuel tank.
