

	The retaining tabs on the door handle key cylinder cover are being damaged or broken during removal and reinstallation.			
Condition	If the vehicle is locked and the passive entry is inoperative, (no function with handle button, no function with key fob), the key cylinder cover must be removed and the key must be used to access the vehicle.			
Cause	Improper removal and installation of the key cylinder cover.  If a sharp object is used during the removal of the cover, then the surface of the cover will be damaged. If the cover is reinstalled by pushing it straight onto the insulator, then the retaining tabs will be damaged or break. This will cause the cylinder cover to be loose or fall off.			

## To Access the Key Cylinder (Driver Side)


The following procedure must be followed to ensure proper retention of the key cylinder cover:


- 1. Pull the door handle (1) to the open position.
- 2. Insert the key (4) into the slot (3) on the bottom of the cover (2) and lift the key upward.
- 3. Move the cover (2) rearward and remove.
- 4. Use the key (4) in the cylinder.

## To Replace the Cover



1. Pull the door handle to the open position.

- 2. With the cover at an angle as shown above, Insert the two tabs (7) at the back of the cover (6) between the seal (4) and the metal base (5).
- 3. Move the cover (6) forward and press the front cover to secure the cover in place (8).
- 4. Release the door handle.
- 5. Check the cover to ensure it is secure.
- 6. If the cover is loose or not seated properly, it is possible that the cover tabs (7) are not seated under the metal base (5).
- 7. Repeat steps to access the key cylinder or to replace the cover.
