



**Subject:** Information on Front and Rear Tire Front Air Deflectors

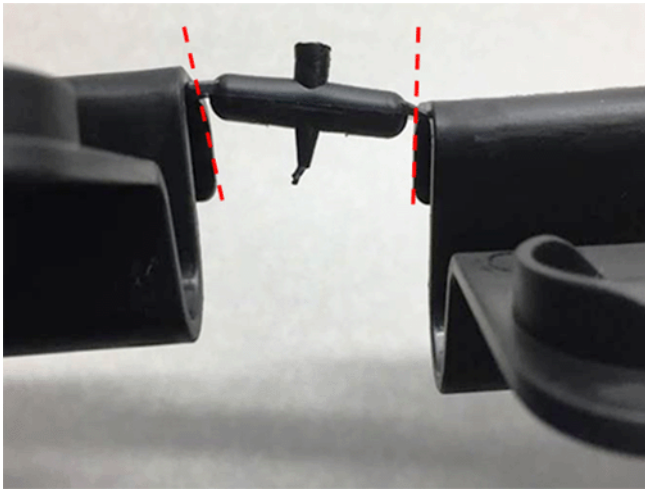

<b>Involved Region or Country</b>	North America and N.A. Export Regions
<b>Condition</b>	The front and rear tire front air deflectors are placed in the vehicles trunk at the assembly plant and installed at the dealership during PDI. They were originally separate left and right side parts, but dealers will begin seeing the two parts connected.
<b>Cause</b>	 <p>As an error-proofing measure to ensure the left and right halves arrive properly, the front (1) and rear (2) sets of parts are now attached to each other.</p>

### Correction

Before installation of the front and rear air deflectors, it will now be necessary to cut the two halves apart, removing the excess plastic.

### Service Procedure



Using scissors, or a similar cutting tool, cut the tabs at the part edge and trim any excess plastic as close to the edge as possible.
