Subject: Brake Lights Always On, Cruise Control Inoperative and/or Discharged Battery

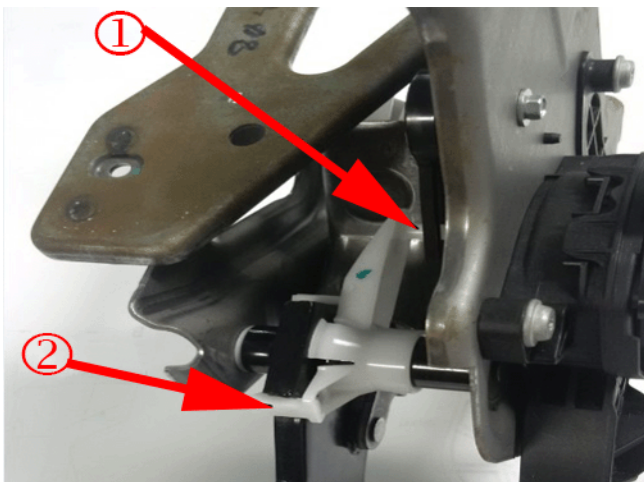

Condition	Some customers may comment that the brake lights stay illuminated, cruise control inoperative and/or a discharged battery.
Cause	This may be due to the plastic Brake Pedal Position Sensor (BPPS) flag bracket allowing too much rotation, causing the BPPS sensor to indicate the brake pedal is applied.

Correction

If you encounter a vehicle with the above concern, complete the following steps:

1. Gain access to the brake and accelerator pedal assembly. Refer to *Brake and Accelerator Pedal Assembly Replacement* in SI.
2. Assure all 3 plastic tabs are latched over the pedal arm. If not, snap tabs into place.



1. Apply force from finger to sensor activation pin and verify for movement on lower retention tab.
2. Lower retention tab.

3. Lightly rotate BPPS activation pin (back and forth) and check for any movement at lower tab.

- If movement is determined, replace pedal assembly. Refer to *Brake and Accelerator Pedal Assembly Replacement* in SI.
- If no movement is found, continue diagnosis referring to SI.
