#### Subject: Battery Goes Dead Intermittently with no Parasitic Drain Noted

Condition	Some customers may comment that the battery goes dead when driven short distanc and then sitting for long periods of time.	
Cause	If the battery drops below 65% state of charge, tail lamps can send a diagnostic request to the BCM causing everything on the BUS to wake up and remain awake until battery drains.	

### Correction

Replace the tail lamps with revised lamps. Refer to *Tail Lamp Replacement* in SI. Using the GR8, Charge and Test to top off the battery after replacing the tail lamps.
