**Subject:** Water Leak And Or Wind Hiss Noise From Sunroof (Leak Between Sunroof Glass And Seal)

**Models:** 2015 Cadillac Escalade Models  
2015 Chevrolet Silverado, Suburban, Tahoe  
2015 GMC Sierra, Yukon Models  
With Sunroof (RPO CF5)  
Built prior to June 1, 2015

***This PI was superseded to update the labor operation. Please discard PIT5456.***

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

### Condition/Concern

Some customers may comment of a water leak and/or hiss type wind noise from the sunroof or headliner area. In many cases, the water leak may be difficult to reproduce and will require an extended water leak test. The water leak may be seen coming from the headliner near the sunroof opening, cellular microphone grill and/or the left and/or right front floor/carpet if it runs down the A pillars.

These concerns could be caused by the sunroof glass seal being out of specification causing water/air to leak between the sunroof glass and seal, as shown below.



### Recommendation/Instructions

To repair this concern replace the sunroof seal.
