Subject: Diagnostic Tip - Service Power Steering Drive With Care Message DTC C0545 00 / AC compressor Inoperative Inoperative

Models: 2015-2016 Cadillac Escalade Models 2014-2016 Chevrolet Silverado 1500 2015- 2016 Chevrolet Suburban, Tahoe 2014-2016 GMC Sierra 1500 2015- 2016 GMC Yukon Models

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.


Condition/Concern

Some customers may comment on any of the following issues:

- Intermittent "Service Power Steering, Drive With Care" message with DTC C0545 sym00 set in the Power Steering Control Module.
- A/C inoperative caused by any of the following: DTC B393B, Fuse F60UA or F35UA being open, or a poor A/C compressor clutch ground.

If, after performing normal diagnosis and the root cause was not found for any of these concerns, they could be caused by the a/c compressor wiring harness (1) shorting on the power steering rack mount (2), as shown below.


Note: To inspect this harness the under body splash/skid shield must be removed and inspected from underneath the vehicle.





Recommendation/Instructions

In many cases, only the insulation is damaged and the copper wire strands are ok. If this is the case, the wire/terminal can be removed from the connector body and heat shrink tubing should be installed to seal the wire, as shown below. If this is not the case, repair the circuit(s) as necessary. After the wire repair is complete, provide protection and secure the harness from contacting the steering rack mounting to prevent future failures.

Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.
