Subject: Second And/Or Third Row Bench Seat Center Belt Buckle Plastic Is Cracked

This PI was superseded to update model and model years. Please discard PIT4547F.

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

Some dealers are finding the second and/or third row bench seat center seat belt buckles have acrack in the plastic cover on the buckle side. This is just a plastic trim cover and will not affect the operation of the belt buckle. It has been found that this could happen if the second or third row bench seat is folded flat and the seat belt is still buckled.

Recommendation/Instructions

During a PDI inspection please ensure that the second and third row bench seat, center seat beltbuckles are unbuckled so the seat belt will not become cracked when a demonstration of the seatfunction is performed. Additionally, if your customer has a seat belt buckle that is found cracked, Inform the customer of the possibility of the crack developing as a result of the center belt beingbuckled when the seat is folded flat.

Please follow this diagnostic or repair process thoroughly and complete each step. If the condition exhibited is resolved without completing every step, the remaining steps do not need to be performed.
