

2016 CX-9 - Active Driving Display (AD-Disp) Is Dim

Some customers may complain about a dim AD-Disp during the day, while at night the AD-Disp works properly. Using the dimmer adjustment does not resolve the concern. This may be caused by the customer using polarized sun glasses during the day.



Polarized Sunglasses

Polarized glasses block horizontal light waves, making surroundings seem clearer and helping to reduce eye fatigue. The AD-Disp functions by reflecting light horizontally off windshield glass, and polarized glasses can make the display seem to disappear.
