Subject: 6T70/75 Transmission Assembly With Harsh 1-2 Shift With No DTCs

Models: 2015-2017 Buick Enclave 2015-2017 Chevrolet Traverse 2015-2017 GMC Acadia

The following diagnosis might be helpful if the vehicle exhibits the symptom(s) described in this PI.

Condition/Concern

2015, 2016, or 2017 Acadia, Enclave, or Traverse equipped with a 6T70/75 Transmission Assembly with harsh 1-2 shift, mostly on light throttle with no DTCs present.

Rare cases the 2-3 shift may be harsh as well.

If the above concern is found it is possible the trans shift adaptive time may not have learned.

Recommendation/Instructions

Driving procedure to learn 2-6 clutch adapts: Drive in M5 to limit the trans to fifth gear, 38 MPH or above, TFT above 30 degree C (86 degree F), approximately 5 miles on flat level ground at a steady throttle. The use of cruise control to hold a constant speed may be beneficial in the adapt learn drive.

After drive procedure, stop and try some light throttle 1-2 shifts, drive another 5 miles if needed.

Second drive learn may be needed, if yes, allow the TEHCM to power down prior to the second attempt.

If no change after the drive learn, follow diagnoses for a harsh shift concern.
