Condition	Some owners may comment on a pop, click, tick, snap, or itch type noise in the steering column when turning left or right during low speeds or parking lot maneuvers. Upon investigation, this concern may be similar to steering wheel to column trim contact, or similar to the noise produced by a SIR coil with a damaged internal tape.
Cause	Unknown

Correction

Inspect/check the following areas for the source of the noise:

- Upper and lower intermediate steering shafts for proper connection and fastener torque, example Doc ID 3637279 and 3637276.
- Steering column mounting bolts and nuts for proper connection and fastener torque.
- Steering column seal, example Doc ID 3273249.
- Steering column shroud, example 3630903.
- Turn signal switch
- Steering wheel
- SIR coil

If the root cause of the noise has not been found after performing the checks listed above, do not disassemble the column any further and replace the steering column assembly. Engineering will be requesting the old column back for review.
