Condition	Some customers may comment that the airbag warning lamp is illuminated. Upon inspection, the technician may find one, or more, airbag DTC(s) stored, either active or history.

Cause



The cause of the condition may be an airbag connector which may be loose or not fully seated. An example is shown in the graphic above.

Correction

Technicians may find one, or more, of the following airbag DTC(s) stored, either active or history: B0012, B0013, B0014, B0015, B0016, B0017, B0018, B0019, B0020, B0021, B0022, B0023, B0024, B001A or B001B.



Important: Any time the airbag connector is disconnected and reconnected, the technician should perform a “push / push” test (NOT A “push /pull”) on the connector, to ensure it is fully seated.

When following the diagnostics for the DTC(s), carefully inspect the airbag connector for complete contact. If the airbag connector is not fully seated, disconnect, reconnect, then verify the repair.
