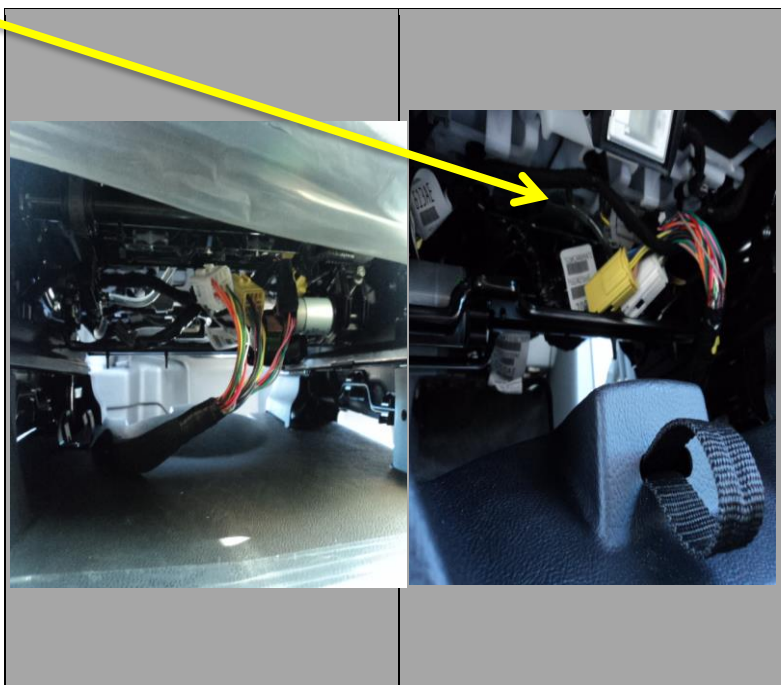

SCOPE

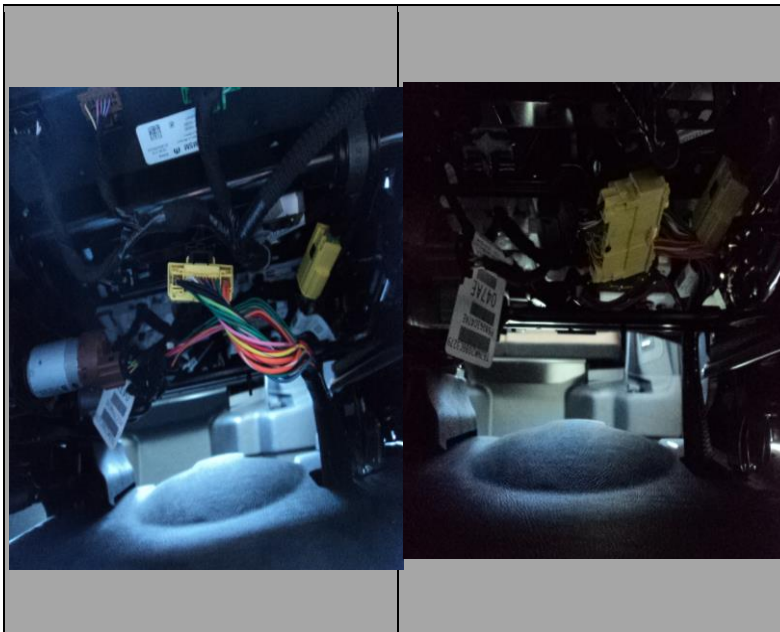
The Chrysler Pacifica has interchangeable front seats. It has been noticed that when moving the front seat to the opposite side, the seat wiring harness may not extend out far enough to be connected to the plug in the B pillar while the seat is in the full forward position. This document provides detailed instructions for the rerouting of the harnesses so that they can be successfully connected.

CONTENTS

1. **Passenger seat:** Begin by removing the wire connectors from the bottom of the seat. (Each connector is different and can only be re-connected to it's mate.)
2. After the connectors are unplugged, **route them over the top of the seat brace** then reconnect the harnesses. This will provide added length to the harness. The harness will be long enough to make the connection through the full distance of seat travel.



3. Driver seat: Begin by removing the wire connectors from the bottom of the seat. (Each connector is different and can only be re-connected to it's mate.)
4. After the connectors are unplugged, route them over the top of the seat brace then reconnect the harnesses. This will provide added length to the harness. The harness will be long enough to make the connection through the full distance of seat travel.



The update is now complete.
