

Service Procedure

1. Raise and support the vehicle. Refer to *Lifting and Jacking the Vehicle* in SI.

Locate the 6, (3 left and 3 right) engine mount-to-engine mount bracket bolts (1).
TIP: The right-side bolts can be accessed through the passenger side wheelhouse area.

- 3. Visually verify that the 3 bolts per side have been tightened. The use of a mirror and flashlight will aid in the inspection process.
 - If the bolts appear tight, no further action is required.

- If the bolts are installed but not tightened, proceed to step 4.
- 4. Replace the three engine mount bolts on the effected side. If both sides of the vehicle display the condition, replace all six bolts. Tighten to 70 Nm (52 lb ft).
- 5. Lower the vehicle.

Dealer Responsibility
