<b>Involved Region or Country</b>	North America
<b>Condition</b>	Some customers may comment that the MIL is illuminated. The technician may find one or more of the following DTCs set: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• P0366</li> <li>• P0014</li> </ul>
<b>Cause</b>	This condition may be caused by a sporadically unlocked exhaust cam phaser that can oscillate during engine start, falsely setting the DTC/s.
<b>Correction</b>	If you encounter a vehicle with the above concern, reprogram the ECM software with the latest software available.

### Service Procedure

**Important:** Stable battery voltage is critical during programming. Any fluctuation, spiking, over voltage or loss of voltage will interrupt programming. Install the EL-49642 SPS Programming Support Tool to maintain system voltage. If not available, connect a fully charged 12 V jumper or booster pack disconnected from the AC voltage supply. DO NOT connect a battery charger.

Update the Engine Control Module (ECM). Refer to *K20 Engine Control Module: Programming and Setup* in SI.
