
Subject: Instrument Panel (IP) Rattle or Buzz Noise



| Additional Options (RPO) | Equipped with Speaker System - Standard Audio (RPO UQF) or Speaker System - 6, Premium (RPO UZ6) |
| Condition | Some customers may comment on hearing a rattle or buzz noise from the IP during certain driving conditions, such as rough or dirt roads. |
| Cause | The cause of the condition may be that for particular radio speaker systems, there may be no speaker mounted in the center and/or right/left side positions in the IP. This may allow the push nuts that normally retain the speaker bolts to rattle when there is no speaker present in that location. |

Correction

Service Procedure



Verify the condition and install bolts to the appropriate IP locations to keep the push nuts stationary. The RPO UZ6 vehicles will require two bolts for the center position only, the RPO UQF vehicles will require six; two per three locations.



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Note: For either RPO, start the repair at the center speaker location.

1. Detach the front center radio speaker grille. Refer to *Radio Front Center Speaker Grille Replacement* in SI.



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
- 2. Install the service part bolt, listed in the part table below, to both of the clinch nut locations shown above.
- 3. Reinstall the front center radio speaker grille.
 - For vehicles equipped with RPO UZ6, no further action is required.
 - If vehicle is equipped with RPO UQF, continue on to step #4.



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Note: It is NOT necessary to remove the windshield garnish moldings to remove the front speaker grilles.

4. Using a suitable flat-bladed tool or trim stick, unlock the retaining tabs and remove the right front speaker grille.



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- 5. Install the service part bolt to both of the clinch nut locations shown above.
- 6. Reinstall the front radio speaker grille.
- 7. Repeat steps #4–6 on the left side speaker grille location.
