## Correction

If you encounter a vehicle with the above concern, program the radio again using the latest USB and SPS calibrations in TIS2web and re-evaluate the concern.

If TIS2web displays a message that advises that the latest USB or SPS calibrations are already present, disregard and proceed with programming anyhow so the current USB and SPS calibrations are overwritten. Refer to *Radio Programming and Setup (UFU, UHQ)* in SI for important USB and SPS programming instructions.

In the unlikely event that this does not resolve the concern, replace the radio.
