## TECHNICAL

**Subject: HVAC Blower Inoperative and/or A/C Button Does Not Illuminate When Pushed**

<b>Condition</b>	Some customers may comment that the HVAC blower is inoperative or that the A/C button does not illuminate once pressed.
<b>Cause</b>	This may be caused by contact in the HVAC control being weak, causing transient voltage on blower on/off PIN of the Body Control Module (BCM) when operating blower knob rapidly.

### Correction

If you encounter a vehicle with the above concern, replace both the BCM and the HVAC control. Refer to the proper replacement procedures in SI.
