

SUBJECT: Trunk Release Difficult to Operate

INTRODUCTION:

This bulletin provides part information and a Service Procedure to address a customer concern of the trunk release being difficult to operate. The release cable may not be operating the trunk latch mechanism properly. The trunk lid cord (wire harness) has been changed with the addition of a new style retaining clip.

A retaining clamp for the trunk release cable has been added to the new trunk lid cord's retaining clip (it is not serviced separately). The illustrations below show the difference between the old and the new style trunk lid cords.

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SERVICE PROCEDURE / INFORMATION:

• After confirming the condition, CAREFULLY release the 2-piece retaining clips and remove the passenger side trunk area inner trim. The retaining clips are reusable.



INSPECTION:

Illustration "A" shows:

- Trunk release cable routing (red)
- Old-style harness retaining clip with no trunk release cable retaining clamp.



Illustration and photo "B" show:

- New-style trunk cord with release cable retaining clamp
- Trunk cable (red) installed with new routing.



• If inspection reveals the trunk release cable has come loose from the retaining clamp of a vehicle equipped with the new-style deck lid cord (Photo C), clip it back into place and retest for proper operation before proceeding with cable replacement.



VERY IMPORTANT: The trunk release cable MUST ALWAYS be secured to the trunk lid cord REGARDLESS if a new <u>or</u> old-style cord (harness retaining clip has no cable retaining clamp) is being used. Use a medium-sized (8-10mm wide) cable tie placed at the trunk lid cord retaining clip and trim off the excess as shown below.



- If securing the trunk release cable to an old-style trunk lid cord with a cable tie as shown above resolves the concern, neither the cable or the cord need replacement.
- If securing the cable does not resolve the concern and trunk release cable replacement is required, follow the procedure in the applicable Service Manual.

REMINDER: The trunk release cable MUST be secured to the trunk lid cord using a cable tie as shown above before reinstalling the trunk area inner trim.

• Re-assemble in reverse order and confirm proper operation to complete the procedure.
