Condition	During Pre Delivery Inspection (PDI), a technician may find two bolts and an instruction sheet in a loose part bag, and/or may find both rear tire front air deflectors missing one fastener per side.		
Cause	The cause of the condition may be that the assembly plant was unable to install the rear tire front air deflector fasteners at these two locations.		

Correction

Install both missing rear tire front air deflector bolts (one per side) from the supplied service kit found in the loose part bag. If kit is missing, order a replacement kit using the Parts Information below.

Service Procedure



1. Reaching under the rocker panel, feel along the rear tire front air deflector for the open hole at the **only horizontal** fastener location, shown circled in the illustration above.

- 2. Install the bolt and tighten to 2.5 N•m (22 lb in).
- 3. Repeat bolt installation on the opposite side.
