Cause	The click/tick noise is created when 4-5-6 clutch is applied within the rotating housing.			
O	The click/tick noise should be considered a normal characteristic of the Allison A1000 transmission.			
Correction	No repairs should be attempted.			
	Transmission durability and longevity are not affected by the tick/click noise.
