




## **INTRODUCTION:**

This bulletin announces a change made to the front lower control arm ball joint boots. The boot material has been changed to provide increased resistance to damage from ozone as shown below.



#### PRODUCTION CHANGE INFORMATION:

New lower arm assemblies with the improved ball joint boots were incorporated into production starting with VIN J8602482.

- The arm assembly must be replaced as the boot and / or ball joint are not available separately.
- The lower arm to crossmember nut and bolt along with the support plate retaining nut and bolt must be replaced as they are all one-time use items.
- It is NOT necessary to replace the lower arm assemblies in pairs.
- Always refer to the applicable Subaru Service Manual for related inspection procedures as part of any diagnosis.
