Client states roof in cargo area is detaching from the transverse support ribs / structural adhesive seeping

Cause:

Adhesive failure

Remedy:

- 1. Photo documentation for warranty claim take pictures incl. tape measure to document the gap size between roof and substructure
- 2. If necessary, carefully lift the roof panel 2-5mm by inserting plastic wedges
- 3. Remove the old adhesive between outer panel and substructure using a plastic wedge
- 4. Prepare for new adhesive (clean with silicon remover A005 989 1971)
- 5. Apply activator A000 989 31 00 (alternative Teroson SB 450)
- 6. Apply new adhesive (blue body shop masking tape and a plastic razor blade can be used to help create a clean professional appearance, see (Final Repair Example.jpg)
- 7. Use the adhesive kit A005 989 61 71 (alternative Teroson MS 930)
- 8. Remove plastic wedges
- 9. Remove excessive adhesive that squeezed out
- 10. Park the vehicle for 10-12 hours to allow for curing
