Condition 1	Some customers may comment that the steering wheel is locked and will not rotate.
Condition 2	Some customers may comment that after jump starting the vehicle from a dead battery, the steering wheel will lock and not rotate.
	Some technicians may notice after charging or replacing the battery, the steering wheel will lock and not rotate.
Condition 3	Some customers may comment that the steering wheel is extremely hard to turn. Some technicians may notice the steering is extremely hard to turn when the vehicle is being physically moved for service.
Cause 1	This condition may be caused by a software anomaly in the Steering Column Friction Control (SCFC) module, causing the locking bolt to engage.
Cause 2	This condition may be caused by a software anomaly in the SCFC module engaging the locking bolt after a battery has been charged or replaced.
