# 971 Airbag Warning with High Cabin Temperature

### Condition

The customer experiences a warning in the instrument cluster for the passenger airbag. This is usually seen when the cabin of the vehicle has high temperatures. The workshop finds a combination of one or more of the following fault codes:

- B101629 Passenger airbag OFF indicator light signal implausible
- B12F129 Passenger airbag ON indicator light signal implausible
- B151329 Passenger airbag ON/OFF indicator lights, text lighting signal implausible
- B151304 Passenger airbag ON/OFF indicator lights, text lighting faulty

### **Technical Background**

This behavior is due to errant handling of high temperature in the overhead console (where the passenger airbag light resides).

#### Service Information

Porsche is aware of this issue and working to produce a bug fix. When the fix becomes available, we will update this bulletin. No advice for permanent corrective action is available at this time. Parts should not be exchanged.
