2008 Passat Service Reminder Reset

Resetting the service interval display

If the maintenance service was **not** done by an authorized Volkswagen dealer or a qualified workshop, the service interval display system should be reset by your authorized Volkswagen dealer or a qualified workshop.



Tips

Do **not** reset the service interval function between scheduled maintenance intervals; doing so will result in an incorrect display.

Applies to vehicles: With Multi-Function Indicator Display (MFD)

Resetting the service interval display

If service was not performed by a Volkswagen dealer, the display must be reset as follows:

- Use the rocker switch on the windshield wiper lever or the buttons in the multi-function steering wheel (where applicable) to select the **Settings**.
- In the **Service** submenu mark the **Reset** menu item and press the **OK** button in the windshield wiper lever or the multi-function steering wheel (where applicable) to reset the service interval display. Confirm the subsequent security check with **OK**.



Tips

- If you reset the service display yourself, the next service is displayed after 9,320 miles (15,000 km) or one year. The service interval is not determined individually.
- Do **not** reset the service interval function between scheduled maintenance intervals; doing so will result in an incorrect display.

Vehicles without menu display (where applicable) in the instrument cluster:

- Switch off the ignition and press the **0.0 / SET** button.
- Hold the **0.0 / SET** button down and switch the ignition on. The service interval display is now in the reset mode.
- Release the **0.0 / SET** button and within 20 seconds press the **☐** button. After a short period, the normal display will return.
