By law, dealers must correct, prior to delivery for sale or lease, any vehicle that fails to comply with an applicable Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard or that contains a defect relating to motor vehicle safety.</p> <p><b><u>Pre-Owned Vehicles in Dealer Inventory:</u></b> Dealers should not deliver any pre-owned vehicles in their inventory which are involved in a safety or compliance recall until the defect has been remedied.</p>

**RE: Urgent Airbag Safety Recall for Your Vehicle**

Dear [Ms./Mr. and Last Name]:

The Bureau of Automotive Repair is contacting you concerning an urgent safety recall issued for your Audi (Vehicle Identification Number [VIN number]). If you no longer own this vehicle, you may disregard this letter.

A safety recall is issued when a vehicle manufacturer or the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) determines that a vehicle or its equipment creates an unreasonable safety risk or fails to meet Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards. Vehicle manufacturers are required to fix the problem by repairing or replacing the recalled part(s).

A recall has been issued for your vehicle because it is equipped with defective air bag(s) that may explode when deployed. To ensure the safety of you and your passengers, please take the following steps as soon as possible:

- 1. Access your vehicle's recall information** – Visit [www.NHTSA.gov/recalls](http://www.NHTSA.gov/recalls) or [www.audiusa.com/recalls](http://www.audiusa.com/recalls) and enter the 17-character Vehicle Identification Number in the VIN lookup tool to review recall information for your vehicle, including important repair instructions.
- 2. Schedule the recall repair** – Contact your vehicle manufacturer at 800-822-2834 or your local Audi dealership to schedule the repair. The recall repair will be made at no cost to you.
- 3. Signup for recall alerts** – Visit [www.NHTSA.gov/alerts](http://www.NHTSA.gov/alerts) to subscribe to NHTSA's Recall Notification Email System to receive alerts about any future safety recalls affecting this or any other vehicle you may own.
