#### IMPORTANT REMINDER: VEHICLES AFFECTED BY SAFETY & COMPLIANCE RECALLS

<u>New Vehicles in Dealer Inventory:</u> It is a violation of federal law for a dealer to deliver a new motor vehicle or any new or used item of motor vehicle equipment (including a tire) covered by this notification under a sale or lease until the defect or noncompliance is remedied. By law, dealers must correct, prior to delivery for sale or lease, any vehicle that fails to comply with an applicable Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard or that contains a defect relating to motor vehicle safety.

<u>Pre-Owned Vehicles in Dealer Inventory:</u> Dealers should not deliver any pre-owned vehicles in their inventory which are involved in a safety or compliance recall until the defect has been remedied.

# **URGENT AIRBAG SAFETY RECALL: IMMEDIATE ACTION REQUIRED!**

# Why am I receiving this notice?

The Georgia Department of Revenue - Motor Vehicle Division and Georgia Department of Driver Services are contacting you personally because your Volkswagen has a recalled airbag that could **kill or seriously injure you and your passengers** if it deploys.

We have received information from Volkswagen that your vehicle requires immediate attention. If the airbags deploy, in some cases the airbags may explode and spray sharp metal fragments or shrapnel toward you and your passengers.

According to records from Volkswagen, your vehicle has not been repaired yet. The potentially lifesaving recall repair is <u>FREE</u>, <u>yes</u> <u>FREE</u>, and parts are available now. Please <u>immediately call a Volkswagen dealer</u> for more information or to schedule a <u>FREE</u> recall repair.

Volkswagen is one of 19 vehicle manufacturers affected by this urgent airbag safety recall. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) reports 16 confirmed deaths in the United States and hundreds of alleged injuries resulting from this defect.
