

Symptom/Vehicle Issue: Vehicle is difficult to refuel.

Discussion: Customer complaint my include vehicle won't take fuel, spits back or nozzle shuts off often or before tank is full.

Inspection/Repair Procedure:

1. Confirm correct filler hose to filler pipe insertion depth (distance A in the figure below). This distance (A) should be 58mm (2.28 in) ±3mm (.012 in). If the measured distance is greater than this, loosen the filler hose clamp and push the hose further onto the filler tube. Hold the tube as steady as possible so that the filler tube housing (top of the filler tube assembly) does not break.

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- 2. Return to the gas station to confirm vehicle now fills normally. If the vehicle still exhibits a hard-to-fill condition, pull the filler nozzle out of the filler tube by 0.5 in 1in. If the vehicle fills normally with no issue, replace the filler tube with the latest part number.
- 3. If the problem persists, continue with normal published hard-to-fill diagnostics.

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
