Condition	Some customers may comment on noise when braking, faded paint appearance on the calipers or brake fluid leaking from the calipers.	
Cause	Note: For vehicles that are frequently used for track events, changing the caliper boots should be part of maintaining the vehicle. The cause of the condition may be the caliper boots are heat checked/cracked, allowing	
	brake fluid to leak. Heat checking will occur when the caliper has been exposed to intense heat created while braking. An example of this damage is shown in the graphic above.	
Correction	Important: Caliper boot kits are available though CCA service parts and should be used to service the calipers. DO NOT replace calipers for this concern.	
	Inspect the caliper boots for cracking, and replace as necessary. Refer to the appropriate Front or Rear Brake Caliper Overhaul in SI.
