





### **Service Procedure**


If you encounter a vehicle with the above concern, obtain the new service part guides and shim material listed in the part table below and complete the following steps:


1. Remove the rear fascia. Refer to *Rear Bumper Fascia Replacement* in SI.




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2. Loosen the 6 nuts securing the impact beam/bar. Fully remove the top two. Refer to *Rear Bumper Impact Bar Replacement* in SI.





- 3. Move the impact beam up 3 mm (0.12 in) so the stud is centered in the hole in the impact beam mounting plate. Make sure both sides are centered.
- 4. Re-secure the impact beam.



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
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5. Replace the left and right (1) rear bumper fascia guides while adding a shim to each guide prior to installation, following the steps below:



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- 5.1. Remove the right or left rear bumper fascia guide from the quarter panel. Refer to Rear Bumper Fascia Guide Replacement in SI.
- 5.2. Cut two 8.5 mm (0.335 in) squares from the barrier material.
- 5.3. Peel the protective backing from one square and stack it on top of the other square.



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5.4. Peel the protective backing from the stacked squares and apply the stack to the outboard, upper rear of the guide, at the location (1) shown in the graphic above.



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- 5.5. Install the rear bumper fascia guide to the quarter panel. Refer to Rear Bumper Fascia Guide Replacement in SI.
- 5.6. Repeat steps 5.1–5.5 on the opposite side.

Important: If the fascia attachment flange is damaged or ripped, the rear fascia will need to be replaced.

6. Reinstall the fascia. Refer to Rear Bumper Fascia Replacement in SI.
