Condition	A dealer may encounter a vehicle with a grind or growl noise coming from the brakes. This noise will normally occur after the vehicle has been sitting for several hours or overnight. It will occur on a light to medium brake application at low speeds for the first few stops after the vehicle has been sitting. The noise may be described as a grind, growl, squeak or squeal noise. It may also be noted that there is a sound and a feel as if the ABS has been activated, however there will be no ABS event actually occurring. In some cases, but not all the noise will go away after a few thousand miles of driving.
