Symptom/Vehicle Issue: Malfunction Indicator Lamp (MIL) Illumination. Diagnostic Trouble Codes P0407 – EGR Sensor B Circuit Low, or P0408 – EGR Sensor B Circuit High Set

Discussion: A small number of customers may experience a MIL illumination. They may also comment that the engine may have a perceived lack of power or misfire. Upon further inspection, a technician may find DTC P0407, or P0408 set in the Powertrain Control Module (PCM). They may also find one or more of the following DTCs.

- P0300 Multiple Engine Misfire.
- P0301 Cylinder1 Misfire.
- P0302 Cylinder 2 Misfire.
- P0303 Cylinder 3 Misfire.
- P0304 Cylinder 4 Misfire.
- P0305 Cylinder 5 Misfire.
- P0306 Cylinder 6 Misfire.
- P049D EGR Control Position Exceeding Learning Limit
- P04DD Cold Start EGR 1 Flow Insufficient Detected
- P045E EGR B Control Stuck Open
- P225D NOX Sensor 1/1 Performance, Signal Stuck Low

NOTE: DTCs P0407, and P0408 are position sensor circuit faults for the Low Pressure (LP) EGR system. The LP EGR valve, and cooler are located on the driver's side rear of the engine. The High Pressure (HP) EGR system does not have an effect on these DTCs. Please ensure that the correct EGR system is being diagnosed prior to replacing any parts.

Rather, it captures all previous cases known that appear to be similar or related to the vehicle symptom / condition. 




If you receive a vehicle with any of the above codes setting along with the P0407, or P0408, concentrate diagnosis on the P0407/P0408 first before diagnosing any other codes.

When either the P0407, or P0408 set, the PCM may actuate the Low Pressure EGR valve in order to determine its position. This may lead to the valve being either open or closed during the wrong times which can lead to the other DTCs or drivability concerns.
