Customer Complaint/Technician Observation: Customer may describe a noise they hear when opening or closing the front door(s) as a grunch, groan, pop, squeak, tick or a click.




Fig 1. Paint markings on door check strap

Discussion: Use a mechanic stethoscope to isolate the noise. If the condition is coming from the front door check, remove the strap. Refer to Service Information: 23 - Body / Doors - Front / CHECK, Door / Removal and Installation. Inspect the strap for paint markings shown in fig 1.

Does the check strap make noise and have the paint markings shown in Fig 1? Yesreplace the front door check with 68375035AF or later. Refer to Star Parts catalog for most current part information.
