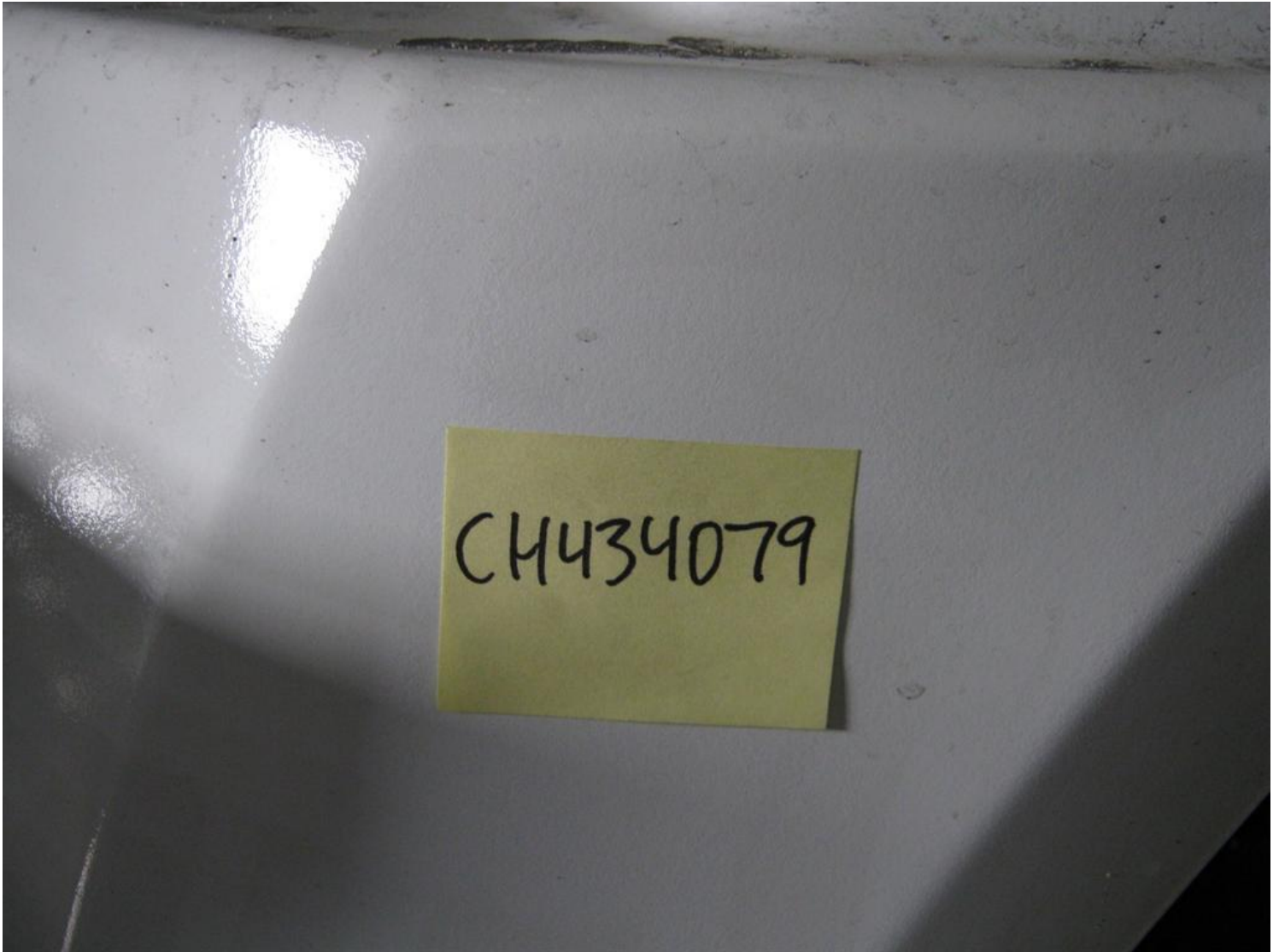

DESCRIPTION

As part of the ProStar bumper redesign (2 piece to 3 piece), the bumper was switched to molded in color grey textured plastic. At the same time, the chassis skirts and fender extensions were also changed to match. The result is that the body color bumpers, skirts, and fender extensions on ProStar and RH will have a textured (Orange Peel) look even when they are painted with a base/clear paint system. Some perceive it to be an excessive "orange peel" look. See below. This is an intended design feature and not a manufacturing defect.

NOTE: This is the same condition for LT plastic chassis skirts and plastic bumpers. But the texturing on LT is not as aggressive so the effect will be less noticeable.
