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WNJ8 - Update to Software Network VR19.0.1 (Workshop Campaign)

Revision: This bulletin replaces bulletin Group 9 135/22 WNJ8, dated July 27, 2022

Model Year: As of 2020 up to 2022

- Important: **CRITICAL WARNING** -This campaign includes steps where control unit(s) in the vehicle will be programmed with the PIWIS Tester. The vehicle voltage must be maintained between 13.5 volts and 14.5 volts during this programming. Failure to maintain this voltage could result in damaged control unit(s). Damage caused by inadequate voltage during programming is not a warrantable defect. The technician must verify the actual vehicle voltage in the PIWIS Tester before starting the campaign and also document the actual voltage on the repair order.
- Model Series: Taycan (Y1A/Y1B/Y1C)
- Concerns: Software update (software version VR19.0.1)



WNJ8 must not be carried out without first carrying out AMB5/WMH0!

Information: Software optimizations are available for various control units for the Taycan.

Campaign Exception for Punch Time Requirements: ANA6, WNJ8, and WNK1

PCNA will make an exception to warranty policy regarding the necessary time keeping procedures when performing the following campaigns: ANA6, WNJ8, and WNK1.

Though warranty policy guidelines state that no technician may be punched on more than one R.O. at the same time, an exception will be made for the ANA6/WNJ8/WNK1 campaigns. Due to the extensive programming time necessary a technician may perform multiple ANA6, WNJ8, and WNK1 campaigns at one time, as long as there is a separate identifiable punch for each on the respective repair order and the total number of campaigns being performed at one time does not exceed 3. The exception will be made so that full "active participation time" does not need to be documented for these 3 campaigns only.

Measures:

- Reprogram the instrument cluster with the latest PIWIS Tester software version.
- Minimum requirement: Version **41.200.010**
- Replace Owner's Manual in the on-board folder in the vehicle with an updated version.

Checklist:	Due to the high number of incorrect programming steps carried out as part of the last software update (VR12.1.1), a checklist was created to improve the overview of the work to be carried out. Information

Before starting programming, the battery charger **must always be**:

- Switched off and back on. Switch it off, allow time for the charger display to go blank, then switch it back on. This is to reset a timer internal to the battery charger itself. There is a default setting in the charger which can cause it to automatically switch from the current Mode to Trickle Charging. Switching it off and on again ensures the charger does not automatically fall back to trickle charging mid-programming.
- Set charge voltage to **14.8 volts**.
- In Supply Mode.
- 1 The basic procedure for control unit programming is described in the Workshop Manual ⇒ Workshop Manual 'Basic Instructions and Procedure for Control Unit Programming Using the PIWIS Tester'.



Information

An active Internet connection with the PIWIS Tester must be ensured.

It is necessary to enroll the technician using the PIWIS Tester.

Vehicles with a PVTS contract must be activated for Service mode to prevent unwanted theft detection during the campaign.

The PIWIS Tester must not be charged using the cigarette lighter!

2 After the backup documentation process, the integration test is started automatically. The result must first be **ignored**.

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- 3 Create Vehicle Analysis Log (VAL) using the PIWIS Tester. Mark the vehicle analysis log you have just created with the attribute **"Pre-VAL"** and after carrying out the campaign, return it using the PIWIS Tester.
- 4 Update various control units to software version VR19.0.1 (Sequence 1).

5 When programming is complete, backup documentation including the integration test is done again. The result must first be **ignored** because this sometimes displays control units that are displayed as faulty despite programming.

To check this, the integration test **must** be started again on the start page by pressing the \cdot F3" button.

If this results in a discrepancy here, the relevant control unit **must** be re-programmed. The central computer (PCM) control unit must **not** be programmed initially because this is programmed in sequence 2.

- 6 The battery charger **must be** switched off and on **completely** once **before** Sequence 2 due to the automatic switchover (trickle charging).
- 7 Select Guest account from the central display (PCM) and activate **Privacy mode** (available in some countries).

i Information

If Privacy mode is not active, programming may be aborted, resulting in a fault in the central computer (PCM). Central computers that are replaced as part of the workshop campaign are checked by Porsche AG; if private mode was not set in the central computer before starting programming, the costs will be re-debited.

i Information

Please inform the customer that all mobile phones must be re-paired following the campaign. Existing/paired mobile phones will appear in the Devices list, but must be deleted & re-paired to be functional.

Please inform the customer that Media --> Favorites have moved. Favorites are now accessed similar to all media sources. Therefore, it may be recommended to re-order the media sources to provide easy access to stored Favorites.

Information

- Resetting the charging profiles is **only** necessary if a **high-voltage charger (OBC 22kW)** is installed in the vehicle.
- As soon as the control unit is selected, the left side of the PIWIS Tester shows whether the charger is 11 kW or 22 kW.
- If the charging profiles are **not** reset, there is a possibility that the Plug and Charge function will **not** be available.

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Reset charging profiles for high-voltage charger (OBC 22kW).

- 11.1 Select high-voltage charger (OBC 22 kW) control unit.
- 11.2 Select Drive links/checks.
- 11.3 Select Load profile, factory setting.
- 11.4 Start the routine with $\bullet F8^{"}$.
- 12 Perform direct rework **in the** vehicle.
 - 12.1 Re-teach the handbrake by pressing the button in the vehicle.
 - 12.2 Engage gear.
 - 12.3 Retract extended rear spoiler.
 - 12.4 Standardize side windows.



Information

The wheel electronics must be taught during the test drive and must **not** be carried out by the technician.

- 13 Remove the **PIWIS Tester (VCI)** from the vehicle and end the **diagnosis** process.
 - 13.1 Lock the vehicle.
 - 13.2 Establish bus idle for **at least** 10 minutes.
 - 13.3 After bus idle, re-connect the PIWIS Tester (VCI) and start the diagnosis again.
- 14 Electronic operating instructions. For more information, see ⇒ *Workshop Manual '9X00IN Diagnostic system: Performing vehicle handover'* (Install Onboard Owner's Manual section).
- 15 Read out all fault memories, process and delete existing faults if necessary.

i Information

If control units are found to have faults that are **not** caused by control unit programming, these must first be **found** and **corrected**. This work **cannot** be invoiced under the workshop campaign number.

16 Press • F3[#] to start the integration test in the control unit selection.

All affected control units should now be successfully re-programmed or checked in the control unit overview and their status.

i Information

If a deviation in the system test is still indicated despite programming being carried out, this must be repeated. If the deviation persists, contact Technical Support.

- 17 Create Vehicle Analysis Log (VAL) using the PIWIS Tester. Mark the vehicle analysis log you have just created with the attribute "Post-VAL" and after carrying out the campaign, return it using the PIWIS Tester.
- 18 Exit the diagnostic application. Switch off ignition. Disconnect the Tester from the vehicle.

i Information

If the navigation database is **not** up-to-date, **malfunctions** cannot be ruled out after updating the central computer (PCM).

The complete update process will take up to 45 minutes.

After inserting the USB stick, a **minimum waiting time** of up to 5 minutes must be observed before starting the update.

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If the update does **not start** and the message **Data for the update on the storage medium is invalid** appears, the current navigation database is already on the vehicle. The update can then be cancelled.

The ignition switches off automatically after 30 minutes. For this reason, the driver's door **must** be opened and closed again once after **25 minutes**. If this is not done, the installation process must be repeated.

By re-inserting the USB stick, it can be checked at any time whether the data was loaded successfully.

- 21 Set battery charger back to a charge voltage of 14.4 volts.

i Information

An excessively high charge voltage can lead to battery defects in other model lines.

- 25 During the test drive, a navigation destination that is further away than the available remaining range of the vehicle must be entered at least **4 times** until charge planning is **fully** charged. Updating the central computer (PCM) takes a set time for charging planning. Only relevant for vehicles with the Porsche Charging Planner function

The central computer (PCM) software update is performed using a USB storage medium. The software version that is specific to each region must be **downloaded** using the software tool **PiUS** (Porsche integrated Update Service) and must be **installed** on a blank USB storage medium.

Pay particular **attention** to the following:

- For this PCM software update, the USB storage medium USB Type A+C 32 GB with the part number V04014999WW000 must be used.
- To use the software tool, **one** blank or re-writable USB storage medium is required for **each** individual software.

• The software available in PiUS must **only** be used in accordance with the instructions provided in a Technical Information published for this purpose.

The software mentioned here must **only** be used on the **vehicles assigned to the campaign**. Damage to the central computer cannot be ruled out if the software is used on other vehicles.

In the event of a fault, logging must **always** be created during programming using •Ctrl" and •L" using the PIWIS Tester.

Porsche AG programmed approx. 100 vehicles before the campaign was published as part of an internal pilot project; **not one single** control unit had to be replaced in the vehicles.

As a general rule, if **aborted** during programming, programming must be continued. The entire sequence can be started again at any time using the campaign code. The control unit that has already been programmed is skipped or programming is started via the integration test.
