Symptom/Vehicle Issue: Water Leak At Headliner Near Driver Microphone

Customer Complaint/Technician Observation: Customer notices water at the headliner mounted microphone (fig 1).



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Discussion: Water found in the microphone area may be due to a loose fastener on the sunroof frame. Fig 2 shows the approximate area of the screw. Perform a water test at the screw location to verify the leak is from this location. Use a cup or bottle to apply the water to the top side of the screw area (drain trough) while looking for water entering below the headliner from this location. It will be necessary to pull the headliner down and use a light to inspect for water. If water is found coming into the vehicle proceed with the below information.



Locate the screw in Fig 3. The screw is in the drain trough forward of the air deflector spring. Lower the headliner (not necessary to remove headliner) to gain access to the screw head T25 size. Refer to 23 - Body / Sunroof, Dual Pane / SUNROOF, Dual Pane / Removal and Installation for further information.



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Rework steps:

- 1. Remove black screw from the leaked joint and watchout for offcentered screw hole at shown in picture-a.
- 2. Fill the entire hole with Kent sealant at shown in picture-b.
- 3. Tighten the screw to 3.5Nm torque.
