ces:The PORSCHE Rear Seat Entertainment (PRSE) is a high-resolution, anti-reflective 10.1-inch touchscreen
(resolution: 1920 × 1080 pixels) with a folding mounting arm.

The touchscreen is installed on the back of the backrest on the driver and/or passenger seat (\Rightarrow *Figure* 1). The angle of the PORSCHE Rear Seat Entertainment System displays can be adjusted.

System optimizations can be carried out using "Over-the-Air" updates. See operating instructions for more information.

Wireless Porsche Bluetooth® headphones, which are ideal for the Porsche Rear Seat Entertainment system, can also be ordered.

Under the individual equipment "YHY - PORSCHE Rear Seat Entertainment (USA)", the PORSCHE Rear Seat Entertainment is also available ex works for new vehicles.

Use in the vehicle:

- Playback of Smart Device App content (e.g. movies) on the PORSCHE Rear Seat Entertainment System via Apple® AirPlay, GOOGLE® Chromecast, screen synchronization (e.g. Samsung® Smart View or Apple[®] screen synchronization).
- Playback of \Rightarrow content via integrated browser
- Playback of content (e.g. films) via HDMI-In interface (HDMI cable NOT supplied!)
- Sound output via Bluetoothphones or jack plugs (3.5 mm)
- Charging of electronic devices via USB Type CDM interface
- Over-the-air updates for system optimizations

Technical requirements:

- Smart device with at least iOS[®] 12 or Android[®] operating system 9.0.
- WiFi connection between Smart Device and PORSCHE Rear Seat Entertainment System
- App compatibility with one of the functions mentioned above

Additional information:

- Availability of services and functions may vary in certain countries
- Internet/WiFi connection can be established via Connect Plus module or by using a smartphone/tablet computer as a hotspot (tethering)
- Depending on the smartphone manufacturer, not all functions are available via hotspot (tethering).
- Some apps restrict the wireless transmission of content
- Playing / transferring Digital Rights Management (DRM) protected content requires a subscription to a paid streaming service in some cases.
- No playback of iTunes content

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NOTICE

Display unit installed/removed/operated incorrectly

- Risk of damage to the surface/leather on front seat or display unit
- Risk of damage to the display unit screen
- \Rightarrow Do not use sharp-edged tools for installing/removing the display unit.
- \Rightarrow During installing/removal: Do not press the display.
 - 1.2 Fold out the mounting arm on the back of the screen. \Rightarrow *Figure 3*
 - 1 Mounting arm
 - 2 Screen

- 1.3 Align the mounting arm with the screen to the socket (back of front seat backrest) and carefully insert it into the socket. \Rightarrow *Figure 4 (similar picture)*
 - 1 Socket (back of front-seat backrest)
 - **2** Screen mounting arm
- 1.4 Grasp the screen on both sides of the frame and carefully push it forward until slight resistance is felt. \Rightarrow Figure 4 (similar picture) -Arrow-

Insert clamps (disassembly tool Radio HAZET

- 2 - Mounting arm clips
- 3 - Screen
- 1.6 Pull the retaining tabs of the fastening arm with clamps (disassembly tool Radio HAZET 4655-1) to the rear towards the screen. \Rightarrow Figure 5 (similar picture) -arrow B-

Simultaneously press the screen with the fastening arm carefully forwards (front seat backrest) until you hear it click into place. ⇒ Figure 5 (similar picture) - arrow C-

1.7 Check that the screen is firmly attached to the backrest of the front seat by carefully pulling and pushing.

 - Network name is displayed in the status line ⇒ Figure 11 -4-

It can take a few minutes to download, depending on the speed of the WiFi connection!

3.3.1 Download software update

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Software update \Rightarrow Question "Do you want to download the file now?" \Rightarrow Confirm (OK)/Reject (undo). \Rightarrow *Figure 16*-**top**-

- 1 "Software Update" menu
- 2 Confirm (OK)
- 3 Reject (undo)
- 4 Abort download
- 5 Specification of download progress as a percentage
- OK: Download starts automatically in the new window. ⇒
 Figure 16 -bottom-
- Reject (undo): Switch to the previous menu. Perform software update download later.

NOTICE

Voltage drop

- Coding/saving process is aborted
- The display unit malfunctions
- \Rightarrow Make sure that the power supply is not interrupted when coding/saving data.
- ⇒ Connect a battery charger with a current rating of at least Nominal value 40 A to the vehicle battery.
 - 3.3.2 Install software update

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Install software \Rightarrow Update \Rightarrow Question "Would you like to install now" \Rightarrow Confirm (OK)/Cancel (Later)

- 1 "Software" menu
- 2 Install update
- **3** OK (confirm)
- 4 Later (cancel)

Check that the battery charger is connected.



Information

The system is not functional while you are updating the system!

• **YES:** Confirm installation with "OK".

- NO: Connect a battery charger. ⇒ Workshop Manual '2X00IN Battery trickle charge'.
- 3.3.3 The following information is displayed when the update is performed:
 - "The system starts when installation is complete!"
 - After update: "System start, Please wait ..."
 - Information after update: Installation successful. Software updated." and confirm the content of the update with "OK".
- Headphones: 4 **ONLY** if wireless (Bluetooth) headphones are used: Connect headphones to PRSE (for more information, see ⇒ Quick Reference Guide for PORSCHE Bluetooth headphones)
 - 4.1 Activate "Bluetooth" connection mode on the PORSCHE Bluetooth headphones



Information

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When you switch on the headphones for the first time, they automatically start in connection mode.

- 4.1.1 Press and hold the on button (⇒ Figure 18-3-) on the PORSCHE Bluetooth headphones for longer than 3 seconds. The signal for "Switched on" sounds in the headphones.
 - L Left side
 - R Right side
 - 1 Headphone charging (type C socket)
 - LED light: Red = Charging, Red/Blue alternately = Pairing mode
 - **3** Button: On / Off / Play / Pause
 - 4 Lever: Forward/reversing coils and volume control

- 4.1.2 Press button (\Rightarrow Figure 18-3-) for longer than 5 seconds to start pairing mode. LED light flashes alternately "red/blue". \Rightarrow Figure 18
- 4.2 Activate Bluetooth on PRSE
 - 4.2.1 Select "WiFi/Bluetooth" connection. \Rightarrow Figure 19-2-
 - 1 Status line
 - 2 "WiFi/Bluetooth" settings
 - **3** "Connection" menu
 - 4 "Bluetooth" menu item
 - 4.2.2 Select "Bluetooth" menu item. \Rightarrow Figure 19-4-
- 4.3 Connecting PORSCHE Bluetooth headphones to PRSE

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- 4.3.1 Confirm the question/information with "OK". Switch off the display again beforehand if necessary by ticking a box. ⇒ *Figure 20-*top-
 - **1** "Pairing mode" information
 - 2 Deselection of display information
 - 3 Device search





- 4.3.2 Select the relevant headphones from the list of available headphones. \Rightarrow Figure 21-2-
 - 1 "Connection" menu
 - List of available headphones
 - **3** Headphones status: connected

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- 4.3.3 If connection successful: Change the font colour to "blue". \Rightarrow Figure 21-bottom-
 - 1 WiFi/Bluetooth connection – status: active
 - 2 Settings

The "Bluetooth" symbol is also displayed in "blue" on the start screen. \Rightarrow *Figure 22*

- 5.3 Select "Engineer menu" \Rightarrow Scroll down until the "Red style" item is displayed. \Rightarrow Figure 25 -top-
 - 1 "Engineer menu" menu
 - 2 Red style
 - **3** Start screen in the "Red style"
- 5.4 Tick the "Red style" menu item. The colours on the screen change from "blue" to "red". \Rightarrow *Figure 25*-bottom-
- 6 Concluding work
 - 6.1 Switch off both screens.
 - 6.2 Disconnect the battery charger. ⇒ Workshop Manual '2XOOIN Battery trickle charge'.
 - 6.3 Store documents in the glove box in the vehicle.
