## **SITUATION**



Uneven ambient lighting emission (bright spots/dark spots) on the door trim panel.

# **CAUSE**

There are several possible causes:

- · Fault in the wiring from and to the LED module
- · Fault in the connector on the LED module
- · Faulty LED module

## **CORRECTION**

Determine the cause of the failure, and repair as needed.

# **PROCEDURE**

- 1. Inspect the routing of the wiring from and to the LED module.
- 2. Inspect the connector at the LED module.
- 3. If the wiring and connector to the LED module are OK, replace the LED module.
- 4. Reassess the vehicle once repair is completed.

## PARTS INFORMATION

When appliable, obtain and confirm the part numbers for your specific vehicle by entering the chassis number in either ETK or AIR which considers specific equipment and/or options.

Refer to AIR for the corresponding Defect Code, flat rate labor operations (including the diagnosis that applies\*) and the flat rate unit (FRU) allowances.

Only one Main labor operation code can be claimed per repair visit.

\*Based on which one applies to your center, please refer to <u>SI B01 01 20</u> or <u>B01 07 20</u> for the applicable procedure for documenting, claiming, and explaining, on the RO and in the claim comments, your diagnosis work time (WT), job/repair work time (WT), and the vehicle repairs your center performed, unless otherwise required by State law.
