- 3. Is the system functional? or is this claim related to a frayed strap?
- 4. Does the fray witness mark on the strap indicate a straight or angle type pull? Take a clear photo showing the direction.
- 5. What is the length and size of the fray? Short, long, wide or narrow? Take a clear photo showing the size.



6. Remove the 3rd row seat back cover to get access to the routing for the release strap and feel the S wire, shown in the photo above, for any weld BBs or burrs. Refer to 3rd Row Seat Pull Strap Replacement in SI.

**6.1.** If any weld BBs or burrs are found, take a clear photo of the area.

7. Pull the strap while searching where the fray mark is in relation to the travel. Does the strap come in contact with anything beside the S wire?



- 8. Check is the routing for the release strap. Was the strap routed through the bezel and over the S wire (1) or routed through the bezel and under the S wire (2)? As shown in the photo above.
- 9. Contact one of the engineers listed below with your findings.
