Customer Complaint/Technician Observation: The owner complains the CEL and service 4wd warning lamps are on with a displayed message to service the 4wd system .The technician observed multiple Diagnostic Trouble Codes (DTCs) in different modules.

DTCs that may be set:

PAM	U0422-00 Implausible Data Received from Body Control Module
RFH	U041E-00 Invalid Data Received from All Wheel Drive Control Module
BSCM	U0403-00 Implausible Data Received From T-Case
CADM	U0418-00 Implausible Data Received from Brake System Control Module 1- Stored U041E-00 Invalid Data Received from All Wheel Drive Control Module

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


Fig 1

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

Repair Procedure: Inspect the D6648A black 8-way transfer case shift motor component connector. Use the push-pull-push method to ensure the connector is not loose and properly seated as shown Fig 1.
