# Manual Transmission - Intermittent Distance To Empty (DTE) Drops To Zero

**Issue:** Some 2024 Mustang vehicles equipped with a manual transmission may exhibit an intermittent <u>DTE</u> reading that drops to 0 with the fuel level displaying near 25% capacity. This may be due to the software level of the <u>PCM</u>. To correct this condition, perform the Service Procedure below to reprogram the <u>PCM</u> to the latest software level using the <u>FDRS</u>.

Action: Follow the Service Procedure to correct the condition on vehicles that meet all of the following criteria:

- 2024 Mustang
- Manual transmission
- Intermittent DTE reading that drops to 0 with the fuel level displaying near 25% capacity

**Warranty Status:** Eligible under provisions of New Vehicle Limited Warranty (NVLW)/Service Part Warranty (SPW)/Special Service Part (SSP)/Extended Service Plan (ESP) coverage. Limits/policies/prior approvals are not altered by a TSB. NVLW/SPW/SSP/ESP coverage limits are determined by the identified causal part and verified using the OASIS part coverage tool.

## **Service Procedure**

1. Reprogram the PCM using the latest software level of the FDRS scan tool.

NOTE: Advise the customer this vehicle is equipped with an adaptive transmission shift strategy which allows the vehicle's computer to learn the transmission's unique parameters and improve shift quality. When the adaptive strategy is reset, the computer will begin a relearning process. This relearning process may result in firmer than normal upshifts and downshifts for several days.
