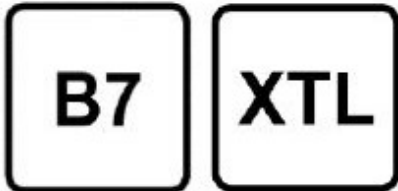

B10-/XTL Motor Vehicle Tolerance (20/24)

Vehicle Type: All Porsche series vehicles with diesel engine

Volkswagen	VW Group (without MAN and Scania) Introduction of XTL diesel fuel (e.g. HVO diesel fuel¹) according to DIN EN 15940 Due to current vehicle production, the proportion of vehicles that can use XTL diesel fuel is growing steadily. The VW Group is also extending the usage of XTL diesel fuel to a large number of existing vehicles. Beside the B7 label² for conventional diesel fuel, an additional XTL label for XTL diesel fuel can be found on the vehicle's fuel filler flap sticker from production onwards.  If there is no XTL label on the fuel filler flap sticker, ask a VW Group dealer whether there is a usage extension for the vehicle and whether XTL diesel fuel can be used. In principle, all 4 cylinder diesel engines (TDI) from calendar week 25/2021; all 6 cylinder diesel engines (TDI), up to and including 170 kW from calendar week 8/2022 and up to 210 kW from calendar week 11/2022 are suitable for use with XTL diesel fuel. Introduction of B10 diesel fuel according to DIN EN 16734 (B10) B10 diesel fuel may not be used for VW Group vehicles. If B10-suitable vehicles are produced in the future, a B10 label must be affixed to the fuel cap in addition to the B7 label for conventional B7 diesel fuel (DIN EN 590). 1 HVO diesel fuel is a widely used name for hydrogenated vegetable oil that can fall under DIN EN 15940 due to its properties. 2 The compatibility label comes from the DIN EN 16942 standard for the definition of fuel labels on petrol stations and vehicles
