## Complaint - Maneuvering Assistant: Implausible Standstill When Reversing (31/25)

Model Line: 911 Carrera (992)

Cayenne (9YA/9YB)
Panamera (YAA/YAB)
Taycan (Y1A/Y1B/Y1C)

Model Year: As of 2021

Equipment: ParkAssist - IPA (M-No. 7X5)

Remote ParkAssist (M-no. FT1)

Concerns: Maneuvering Assist

Cause: On the affected vehicles and equipment variants, it is possible that the vehicle will be implausibly braked to

a standstill by Maneuvering Assist when reversing (v < 10 km/h (6 mph)). Maneuvering Assist triggers braking to a standstill if a relevant obstacle is detected in or on the driving path of the vehicle when reversing. This is generally the case if the Park Distance Control already warns the driver with a continuous

tone. Occasionally, the function also reacts subjectively to objects when not necessary.

If the fault memory entry "B187A00 - ParkAssist Abort" is also entered passively in the assistance systems

control unit when reading out the fault memory, this can be ignored.

Cause: Narrow entrances, garages, rough terrain, etc. promote this defect.

If this repeatedly occurs in certain situations and prevents the driver from driving backwards even though there is no relevant obstacle, Maneuvering Assist can and should be temporarily or completely deactivated. This deactivation may sometimes not be intuitive for the customer.



## Information

The fault memory entry "B187A00 - ParkAssist abort" is stored in the control unit for each ParkAssist process actively aborted by the driver.

Action: In the event of a complaint, explain to the customer the current operating principle of Maneuvering Assist via

"Reversing (v < 10 km/h (6 mph))" and show the options for deactivation. In particular, the temporary option disastly via the comers accord

directly via the camera screen.
