Condition	A customer may comment that one or both rear tail lamps do not illuminate intermittently. All tail lamp functions may be inoperative or only a portion such as a stop lamp, park lamp and/or turn signals. A customer may also comment that they experience a turn signal that flashes fast.
Cause	The cause of this condition could be an internal fault with the tail lamp assembly.

Correction

If after performing normal SI Diagnostics and a root cause is not found, then replace the affected tail lamp assembly.

Note: Some models are equipped with Liftgate Tail lights E103L/E103R, example Document ID: 6879995, and an issue with one of the Liftgate Tail lights can cause the Rear Body Tail Lights E42L/E42R to be inoperative. Repair any issues with the Liftgate Tail lights before replacing a Rear Body Tail Lights E42L/E42R.

Important: After replacing a tail lamp assembly, confirm the new service part does not have the same condition by operating all the tail lamps and hazard flashers for several minutes.

Warranty Information

For vehicles repaired under the Bumper-to-Bumper coverage (Canada Base Warranty coverage), use the following labor operation. Reference the Applicable Warranties section of Investigate Vehicle History (IVH) for coverage.
