Subject: Detroit Assurance Kentucky Interstate 71 Road Hazard

Dear Customer,

Our records indicate that you are the owner of certain vehicles and therefore DTNA has decided to share the following information with you.

DTNA has become aware that—due to recent modifications of an overpass on Interstate 71 southbound over Moser Farm Road near Louisville, Kentucky, USA—vehicles equipped with Detroit Assurance may perceive a road hazard and engage Automatic Emergency Braking (AEB). (This issue applies only to the southbound direction of roadway. The northbound overpass does not contain a feature causing similar issues.) The issue is most pronounced in the center lane of travel. DTNA has notified the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet of this issue and has asked them to resolve it. DTNA also sent a team of engineers to inspect the area and, based on observations, believe this issue is not likely unique to Detroit Assurance.

Until the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet resolves the issue, DTNA highly recommends that you avoid driving on this overpass. If you proceed with driving on this overpass, our investigation demonstrated that the far-right lane may be least likely to engage AEB. If you drive in the center or left lane, you will need to be prepared to override AEB in the event the system detects a hazard.
