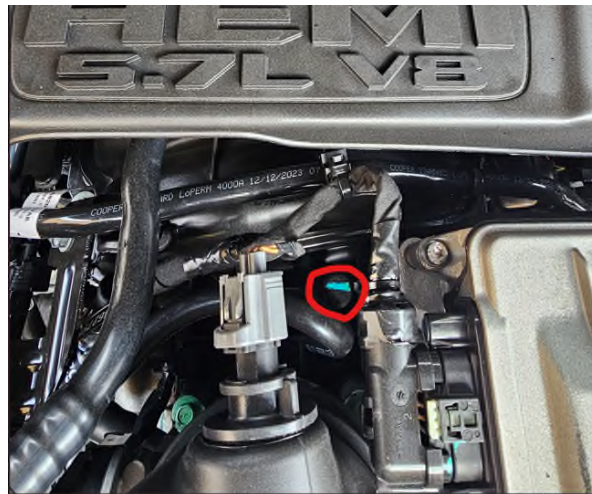

**Customer Complaint/Technician Observation:** The customer's complaint may include a MIL-on/CEL-on (Check Engine Lamp) condition. Upon further investigation, the tech may discover a DTC (Diagnostic Trouble Code) for **P04FC-Crankcase Ventilation System Performance** set in the PCM (Powertrain Control Module).

**Discussion:** If the condition described above is found, perform the inspection listed below before following the published diagnostic process in Service Library for the DTC.

- Check in the under-hood location circled in red shown below for an unused vacuum fitting on the intake manifold.

- Make sure that there is a cap installed on the fitting. An uncapped fitting looks like the one below circled in red.



- If there is a cap installed, continue on to perform the published diagnostic routine for P04FC found in Service Library.
- If there is no cap found, install a vacuum cap, erase the DTC and follow the repair verification testing to ensure the cause for the DTC has been repaired.
