Condition	When installing the accessory brake upgrade kit RPO 5JL it involves reprogramming the Brake System Control Module (BSCM) with an updated calibration. The only reason for the updated BSCM calibration is to update the brake pad life monitoring system.
Cause	Due to a late release of calibrations, they were not available at the being of productions.

Correction

The BSCM calibrations, needed for the GM accessory brake upgrade kit RPO 5JL, are now available. The calibrations can be requested through Techline Customer Support Center (TCSC) using the applicable method below:

- For US ONLY: Calibration support does NOT require a call to TCSC and can be provided by using the CXConnect portal in GlobalConnect. If additional support is needed once the CXConnect case is created, contact TCSC at 1-800-828-6860. If calling is required, select "Prompt 3" for VCI support. For US only: A CX Connect case is highly recommended in order for the team to provide the quickest support. In the near future, a CX Connect case will be required for support.
- For Canada: Contact TCSC at (English: 1-800-828-6860, French: 1-800-503-3222).
- For all other regions: Contact your regional Technical Assistance team for Global Techline Support.

Please contact any customers that previously had the accessory brake kit installed to have the BSCM calibrations updated.
